Rainier was a very small town when some of these early Marshals served, a news media reports the population to be 200 in 1889 and that there were but 18 families besides a number of bachelors. His duties as Marshal were performed along with his regular employment and he received a stipend for each service. 1886..the first duty assigned the Marshal was to pick up swine running loose and to impound them and he was allowed .50 for each animal. Later he was asked to build a corral in Moeck's Addition and to impound loose cattle. His second duty was to check the saloons and see that they obey the law. The Marshall was in charge of the street lights and they had to be lighted each night. He had to see that the citizens built board sidewalks as ordered by the Board of Trustees. He occasionally escorted the proverbial drunk home and attended to the wants of those families put under quarenteen when an epidemic struck the town. On April 25th 1892 the Trustees made it the duty of the Marshall to attend each and every show or exhibition and for which he would receive \$1 for each attendance. As the town began to grow the Marshal's pay became a salary of \$20.00 in 1900. town

In 1902 the Marshal was instructed to build a tool house for city tools 6'X8' and he became guardian of the Town fire apparatus.

In 1902 there was a smallpox epidemic and the Marshal attended those under quarenteen..C.A.Girt was paid \$40 for use of his scow as a pest house. On December 9, 1902 the Marshal was instructed to deputise James Jesse as a peace officer @ \$2.50 per month. Mr. Jesse was watchman for several private interests at the time.

In 1907 the Town had grown so fast that the Marshal was put upon a full time basis and granted the right to hire a deputy when needed. In 1908 the old system of a Board of Trustees bowed out and the new City system with a Mayor and Councilmen took effect.

In 1908 James Jesse took office as daytime Marshal and P.S.Struthers as his deputy night Marshal.
